Douglas Smith made a motion to adjourn the organization meeting at 7:15 p.m. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion.

Douglas Smith opened the regular township meeting at 7:17 p.m.

Douglas Smith read over the agenda and asked if there were any comments from visitors or residents.

Keith Niver attended the meeting about a letter he received in the mail. He says he has been keeping up with the building and the grass has been mowed and brush has been trimmed. He also noted that he is allowed to keep one vehicle on the property. He inquired about what the Supervisors would like him to do. He will try to do the repairs to the roof as soon as he can. Keith stated that he would like to sell the property and mentioned a price of \$40,000 and the buyer assumes all the debt. He will not check into the debt on the property, that will be up to the buyer. The Supervisors will take this information under consideration and review the situation and options available.

A motion was made to approve the minutes for the December 16, 2022 by Bob Nelson. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Linda Farnsworth made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report dated January 3, 2022. Bob Nelson seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Bob Nelson made a motion to approve the payment of bills in the amount of \$15,037.67 for the general fund, \$14,977.81 for the sewer fund, \$6,701.62 for the sewer II fund, \$3.00 for the state fund, \$493.55 for the water fund. Also, approval for payment of any utilities that may come due before the next regular scheduled meeting. The motion was seconded by Douglas Smith. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Bob Nelson reported that the grader was picked up by Cable and transported to a repair shop.

The road crew has been keeping up with any issues that arise.

Douglas Smith made a motion for adjournment at 7:57 PM. Bob Nelson seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.
