

MINUTES FOR MEETING OF JUNE 10, 2026

The regular meeting of the Pine Grove Township Supervisors was held on Wednesday, June 10, 2026 at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall. Supervisors present were Douglas Smith, Robert Nelson and Linda Farnsworth. Others present were Barbara Johnson, Timothy Bevevino, Dave Schwanke, Richard Barrett, Dave McJunkin and Julie Parmenter.

Douglas Smith called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag.

Douglas Smith read over the agenda and asked if there were any comments from visitors or residents.

Barbara Johnson spoke regarding the recent sewage incident on Willow Lane. She noted that she was in California at the time of the incident and it was her maintenance worker that alerted her to the issue. She expressed her dissatisfaction with the process and how it has been handled. She feels that one of the Supervisor's should take control of the remaining restoration and expedite it. She also stated that she would like to see a timeline for completion and would like the Board to drive this to completion. She also stated she would like water tested over the summer and would like the new top soil that has been installed to be repaired so that it drains properly. The Supervisor's asked Mr. Bevevino for his advice on this situation, to which he recommended that Ms. Johnson should contact her insurance company regarding any additional repairs from this accident. The Supervisor's informed Ms. Johnson that they have paid for restoration and clean-up costs to date but any further expense from this accident would need to be taken up with her insurance company. Barbara Johnson advised that she will contact her insurance company regarding any further restoration expenses.

A motion was made to approve the minutes for the May 22, 2026 meeting by Bob Nelson. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Linda Farnsworth made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report dated June 10, 2026. Bob Nelson seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Bob Nelson made a motion to approve the payment of bills in the amount of \$26,620.92 for the general fund, \$28,937.56 for the sewer fund, \$7,125.00 for the sewer II fund, and \$26,064.47 for the water fund. Also, approval for payment of any utilities that may come due before the next regular scheduled meeting. The motion was seconded by Linda Farnsworth. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Next was the road report from Dave McJunkin. Dave informed the Supervisor's that he has not rented the grinding machine yet because he wants to be sure he has the time to get use out of it. He is not sure how this is going to work. There was some discussion on this and they agreed that the only way to know if it is going to work is to rent it and see how it goes. The Supervisor's advised Dave to rent the grinder and get as much work done with it as they can in the time allowed.

Dave Schwanke reported on the calls that the Fire Department has responded to and that they have 3 potential new members. He informed the Supervisor's that there is no update on the EMS merger at this time. He advised the Supervisor's that there will be federal agents training at the fire hall this weekend in preparation for the arrival of the Rainbow people to the area. Dave also stated that they

are going to do some upgrades to Werner Park. The improvements will include replacing the bleachers and some drainage repairs. They are hoping to put in some restrooms at the park next year.

There was a complaint from the resident on Williams Street regarding damage to his mailbox. The Supervisor's advised that the Township has the same policy for this as they do for snowplowing. The mailbox is located within the road right of way and it is not our policy to repair mailboxes damaged in the road right of ways.

Next was the condition of the Howard Road. A resident stopped into the office to advise that since the recent work on this road it is very rough. It was discussed and noted that it is rough because the road crew has been working on this road but it takes time to get the work done properly.

The Lions Club holds their meetings in the office conference room, typically after the water meetings. Since the water meetings are changed occasionally, this leaves the Lions member with no access to the building. The Supervisors were in agreement that an extra key be made for the Lions to use.

Next was the Estate of Eleanor Johnson Subdivision. This subdivision is located along US Route 62 and Swede Hill Road. This proposal severs Lot 2 (1.9917 acres) and Lot 3 (.5661 acres) from the residual lot (WN-2-1530). Lot 2 will be conveyed, and Lot 3 is to be annexed to Lot 2 in a separate calendar year. Residual Lot 1 (193.6122 acres) will be retained by Darrell C. Johnson Estate. The Supervisors approved the Estate of Eleanor Johnson Subdivision.

Bob Nelson made a motion for adjournment at 8:15 PM. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.
