

### MINUTES FOR MEETING OF MAY 22, 2026

The meeting of the Pine Grove Township Supervisors was held on Friday, May 22, 2026 at 8:30 AM at the Town Hall. Supervisors present were Doug Smith, Robert Nelson and Linda Farnsworth. Others present were Dave Schwanke, Dave McJunkin and Julie Parmenter.

Doug Smith opened the meeting at 8:31 a.m.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag.

Doug Smith read over the agenda and asked if there were any comments from visitors or residents.

No visitors were present.

A motion was made to approve the minutes from the May 13, 2026 meeting by Bob Nelson. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Dave Schwanke spoke on the ambulance merger situation. He advised they are looking into the financial aspect of this and they will continue to work towards some type of agreement. The Supervisor's inquired as to what direction they should go with the Emergycare contract. Dave suggested that he would like to try to re-negotiate with Emergycare on their services.

Bob Nelson made a motion to accept the bid from Suit-Kote Corp. for approximately 3,378 SY Asphalt Seal Coat to be applied to East Street at a price of \$3.85 per SY, delivered and applied with a total cost of \$13,005.30. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Bob Nelson made a motion to accept the bid from Suit-Kote Corp. for 10,000 gallons HFRS-2, delivered and applied at a price of \$3.45 per gallon with a total cost of \$34,500.00. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Bob Nelson made a motion to accept the bid from Midland Asphalt Materials for 10,000 gallons MC-70, delivered and applied at a price of \$3.986 per gallon with a total cost of \$39,860.00. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Linda Farnsworth made a motion to accept the bid from IA Construction for 2,500 tons No. 8, LBW 1.0% aggregate, delivered at a price of \$21.00 per ton with a total cost of \$52,500.00. Bob Nelson seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.


Resolution #5-22-26 for the Destruction of Specific Records was presented. A listing of tax records, sewage reimbursement applications, reports of elected and appointed officials, statements of financial conditions, zoning ordinance violations and zoning permits are on this resolution. Bob Nelson made a motion to pass Resolution #5-22-26 for the Destruction of Specific Records. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

The recent sewer malfunction on Willow Lane was reviewed. The new wireless real time alarm system has been installed at that location. The clean up is complete and landscaping has been done.

A complaint was received in the office regarding a resident parking his vehicles in the road on Race Street. The resident is concerned that this is a safety concern with the inability to see oncoming traffic and the fact that children ride bicycles in the area and this could be a problem. The Supervisors advised the secretary to contact the solicitor regarding this issue and see what our options are before proceeding.

Doug Smith made a motion for adjournment at 9:50 am. Linda Farnsworth seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.
